Priest's Message

Sisters and brothers in Christ.

'Blessings' is how I end conversations. I wonder what that means to you - or if you end any communication to others in a similar vein. Let me explain. It means that I am consciously asking God's ' sanction' on all of our discussions, both the overtly and covertly. Sometimes I listen into the spaces between the words, for the silence can be as loaded as sound. It also wishes a blessing to the recipient of the message, a prayer that its contents are found to be acceptable and speak to the 'listening ear'.

Text messages frequently find favour over the spoken - that instant, impersonal flow of words: safe and 'done'. It's a shortcut, usually. It creates the impression that we are in haste.

For me, face to face meetings are the best. It means we can pick up all the nuances, the glances, the fleeting expression, so it becomes a multidimentional exchange. Afterwards, both should be nourished and even enlightened!

Let us look after our friendships and relationships. Each of us is God's unique creation and you and I can make a vital difference to someone who passes by, meeting informally, or at a sit-down to share.

It gives us the joy within, blends us together and makes for a community of joy, trust and co-existence: all values cherished by our Saviour, Jesus Christ!
