Rootedness. You and I are deeply planted in tradition - family, culture, church and in the world. So are the festivals which extend even way back into pagan times. Lammastide is one:


1st August is known as Lammas Day or as the Gaelic festival period of Lughnasadh. Lammas origins lie in the Christian liturgical calendar, its name deriving from the Anglo-Saxon *hlaf-mas* meaning *loaf-mass*. It marked a time when the agricultural year and the Christian calendar came together. From Mediaeval times it marked the end of the hay harvest and the beginning of the grain. Our churches still dedicate a Sunday to thanksgiving for the harvest, which promises to be a bumper one this year, praise God!

Our spiritual lives are flushed by the seasons: the Autumn equinox on 23 September reminds us to store away for winter: food and of the spiritual kind; how we care and adjust, as God's beloved.

Michaelmas is a term used by public schools to mark the first term of the year. Reflected in fields and gardens, the cheeriness and resilience of Michaelmas daisies along walkways, fields and in gardens and their cheeriness reflects the Feast of St Michael on the 23 September.

So, in the midst of the flourish of activity in nature, our rich tradition and celebrations, may we too allow the seasons their glory, in this world God created for our pleasure and stewardship.
